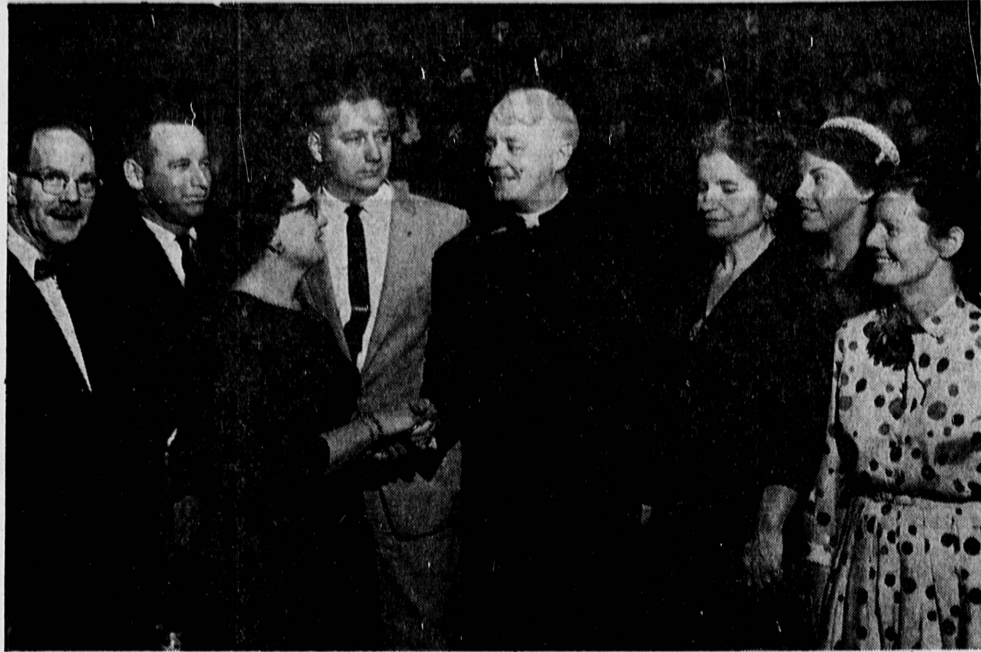

Douglas Missile Sales Soar Near Half a Billion
Missile sales of nearly half a billion dollars were reported by Douglas Aircraft Co. Tuesday for its fiscal year ending Nov. 30, 1959.
The total was \$443 million, a figure additionally significant, because it exceeded, for the first time, the volume of military aircraft deliveries, valued at \$336 million.
These were highlights of an annual report to stockholders which further disclosed that, with seven major programs under way, this aviation pioneer is now firmly launched on a challenging new career of space exploration.
Off-setting these optimistic long-range prospects were the year's substantial losses of \$33,822,000, or \$8.86 per share, resulting from heavy costs and write-offs on the DC-8 jetliner program.
With further charges of this nature "now largely behind us," the company expects that 1960 deliveries of the DC-8 "will produce earnings," declared Board Chairman Donald W. Douglas and President Donald W. Douglas Jr., in a jointly signed message to stockholders.

Marines Grant 4-Month Delay To Enlistees
The Marine Corps' special 120-day delay enlistment program which allows men the opportunity to enlist now and remain at home up to four months is still available.
The announcement, made today by Lt. Col. James Antink, Marine Recruiting Officer of the Southern California-Arizona area, pointed out that this program is especially designed for high school seniors who expect to join the service later this year after graduation.
According to the Marine Recruiting Officer, a man who enlists under this program cannot be drafted because he is enlisted in the Marine Reserve and given orders to report for active duty after high school graduation.
Men who enlist in this program have the advantage of fulfilling four months of their military obligation while finishing high school and are earning an increase in service for pay purposes before reporting for active duty.
