Written by Diane Link, a recreation leader in the Torrance Recreation Department, the article tells of the final phase of a three-step camping program which was realized last summer when an eight-day camping session was held at Big Bear Lake.

THE FIRST step outlined by Miss Link was the two-hour training sessions in camping fundamentals provided by the traveling day camp.

A REGULAR day camp marked the second phase of the program, and more advanced
camping skills were taught. The
day camp sessions ran from
10 a.m. until 4 p.m. from Tuesday through Saturday except

skills.

The final phase is the eight day mountain outing, giving the young campers an opportunity to put their newly acquired skills to use.
