Garden Checklist

By California Association of Nurserymen

1. Give Bermuda Grass lawns a stiff raking with a steel rake to get up runners. Then cut close and feed as soon as it start to "green up"-adding some seed is a good idea, too. If you want to do away with Bermuda Grass, there's a selective weed killer to do the job. 2. Prune wistaria heavily after spring bloom if vines

are getting out of hand. 3. Remember fuchsias bloom on new wood, so prune

heavily when danger of frost is over if you want to insure a high proportion of new growth on the shrub.

4. Sprout begonia tubers in flats of peat and sand indoors. Set them out after all danger of March frost is past. 5. Prune Acacias after bloom to keep them from growing to unwieldy size. Don't be shy with the shears.
