

Three Spartan Track Records Fall in Wind-Swept Victory Over North High

Three school records fell Tuesday when South's high flying track and field teams scored a triple win over North in winds estimated at 25 miles an hour at North High.

New varsity hurdles and varsity pole vault standards were set by John Robinson, Steve Vroman, and Roger Smith as the Spartans swept nine of 12 events in the cross-town meet.

Robinson lowered the 120-yard high hurdle mark to 15.2 and Vroman—who was second in the 100 and broad jump and anchored the winning relay team—set the mark for the 180 lows (20.3) and Smith went 12 feet in the pole vault for a new record.

South took the meet by a 73½ to 30½ tally. The Spartans are unbeaten in all three divisions for four dual meets.

Ted Ross, a junior, copped both sprint races for South. The Spartans, coached by Dick Scully, host a triangular meet Friday afternoon with Torrance and Culver City, beginning at 3 p.m.

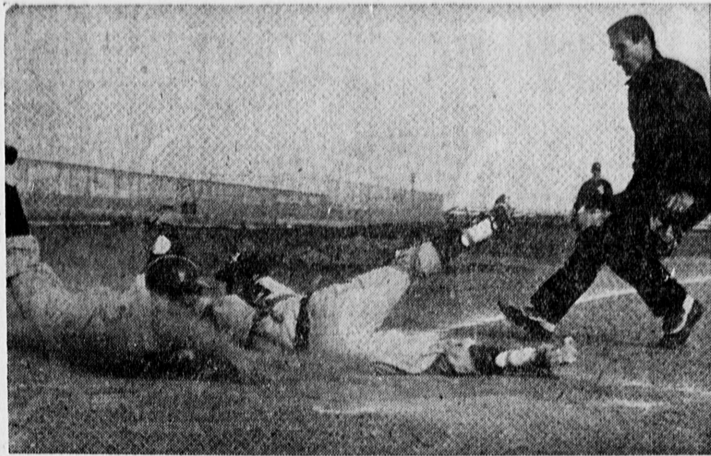

Again how lucky we are to be living near our Southern beaches, the only area where these fish can be found. People all over the world have heard of them, but so few have actually seen them. A large incoming-tide washes them up on the beach where the female lays her eggs by digging a hole in the sand with her tail. Only the front fins and head will be above the water. On the next wave the male will ride in and fertilize the eggs. Then, having completed this incredible biological necessity, they return again to the sea.

Dean Barkdull and Mott Houdashelt have been going surf fishing this past week but very little luck accompanied them, there was only standing room on the beach. Mott said he got a lot of Bumps, but they weren't good eating. Sounds like he'd better stick to hunting.

Dick Felker just came back from the Rio Hardie, below Mexicali, and says the fishing is poor due to the low water level. But it should pick up soon and he'll let us know.

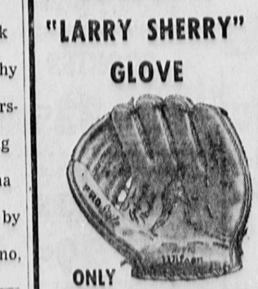
