from the Pacific Ocean to the Orange County Boundary. This portion is an essential link in the overall route and will serve a rapidly growing residential and industrial area. This is a continuation of the stage construction program for Del Amo Blvd. in which the County has currently budgeted almost \$800,000 and has spent over one-half million dollars in the last three years.

Pay Phones Converted to Direct Dial

Dialing calls direct to distant points throughout the Los Angeles extended area from a coin telephone is now possible in some telephone prefix areas, according to an announcement this week by Pacific Telephone manager R. S. Pyle. The new service, called "coin zone dialing," permits users of coin telephones to dial their calls — without operator help — beyond the minimum charge local zone.

TO DATE only a small number of public pay telephones have been equipped with the new mechanical ability, the manager said, but the company has plans to convert all of more than 23,000 in Torrance and the Los Angeles area by the end of 1963.

Here's how coin zone dialing works: The user picks up the receiver and makes a ten-cent local call deposit. Then he dials the number he wishes that is beyond the local call zone.

A SPECIALLY marked lamp on an operator's switchboard shows her at a glance that a coin zone dialing call is being made. A colored strip below the lamp tells her how much the caller is to be charged for an initial three-minute period.

She then plugs-in to a corresponding lamp jack and asks the customer to make the proper deposit. When this is done she withdraws the plug, permitting the call to proceed. If the call goes into an overtime period, the operator asks the caller to signal when

through, then checks to manually time the call.

COIN TELEPHONES with the prefixes of DI-7 (Canoga Park), FA-8 (Torrance) and EA-2 (El Segundo) have already been converted to coin zone dialing. Instruction cards on the phone explain the method to users.

Other prefixes scheduled for CZD this year include DA-6 (Lomita), PO-5 and RO-7 (North Hollywood) HU-2, HU-3, SP-3, OL 1, 2, 3, 4 and 6 (L.A.), OR-0 (Inglewood), and DI-9 (Reseda).

Peebles suggested that the residents of Bluff St. submit a signed petition to the Torrance City Council and ask that the matter be placed on their agenda for an early hearing before this group.
