Notice is hereby given that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles hereby seals proposals or bids for the construction of sanitary sewers and trench and street resurfacing in County Improvement No. 2083-M (21st Place) and other rights of way in accordance with the terms and provisions of the plans and specifications for said improvement.

Proposals or bids, will be received by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, at the Public Counter Room 500, Los Angeles County Engineering Building, 108 West 2nd Street, Los Angeles 12, California, until 5:00 o'clock a.m. on the 26th day of August, 1960, and will be opened, examined and declared by the County Engineer at 9:15 o'clock a.m., on the same day in the Hearing Room, Room 101 in said Los Angeles County Engineering Building.

Each submitted proposal must be accompanied by a certified check or by an acceptable bond payable to the order of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles in the amount equivalent to at least ten (10) per cent of the total aggregate amount of the bid, as a guarantee that the bidder will within fifteen (15) days after the award of the contract, have entered into and executed the contract and furnish the required bonds in connection therewith.

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RESERVE THE RIGHT TO REJECT ANY OR ALL BIDS, AND TO WAIVE TECHNICAL ERRORS AND DISCREPANCIES, IF TO DO SO SEEMS TO BEST SERVE THE INTERESTS OF THE COUNTY.

PREVAILING WAGE SCALE: Pursuant to the provisions of the Labor Code of the State of California the County Board of Supervisors has ascertained the prevailing rate of per diem wages in dollars, based on a working day of eight hours, for each craft or type of workman or mechanic needed to execute the proposed contract.

THE CONTRACTOR shall, as a penalty to the State or political subdivision on whose behalf the contract is made or awarded, forfeit ten dollars for each calendar day, or portion thereof, for each workman paid less than the stipulated prevailing rates for any public work done under the contract by him or by any subcontractor under him, and the body awarding the contract shall cause to be inserted in the contract a stipulation to this effect.

Provided that overtime rates, rates of pay for Saturdays, Sundays and holidays shall apply to those holidays as recognized in the collective bargaining agreement applicable to the particular craft, classification or type of workman employed on the project.

TH 904 2856 NOTICE OF SALE OF BONDS COUNTY IMPROVEMENT NO. 2083-M

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN in the matter of County Improvement No. 2083-M (21st Place) that sealed bids or proposals will be received up to 5:00 a.m., California Daylight Saving Time, on Tuesday, the 30th day of August, 1960, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, at its office at 501 Hall of Records in the City of Los Angeles, for the purchase of bonds to be issued in accordance with the provisions of Division 12 of the Streets and Highways Code (Municipal Improvement Code of 1913), and Division 12 of the Streets and Highways Code, for the acquisition of rights of way and for the construction of sanitary sewers under the provisions of the Municipal Improvement Act of 1913.

Said bonds shall be issued for all unpaid assessments or portions thereof which amount to fifty dollars (\$50.00) or more and shall be in the respective amounts as set forth in the assessment for County Improvement No. 2083-M. Said bonds will be dated the 3rd day of July, 1960, and shall bear interest at the rate to be determined at the sale thereof, provided, however, that said rate shall not exceed the maximum rate of six per cent (6%) per annum, computed on the basis of one-fourth (1/4) of one (1) per cent.

Said bonds and the coupons thereon shall be issued substantially in the form authorized for the issuance of bonds under Division 12 of the Streets and Highways Code of the State of California. These bonds shall be serial bonds and shall extend over a period ending nine (9) years from the second day of January next succeeding the first September 1st following their date, and an even annual proportion of the principal sum thereof shall be payable, by coupon, on the second day of January following the next September 1st following their date, until the whole is paid, and the interest shall be paid quarterly, annually, by coupon, on the second days of January and July, respectively, of each year following the date of the bonds.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF BONDS TO BE SOLD IS TWENTY (20) (20) IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FOURTEEN THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE CENTS (\$14,683.83).

Said bonds will be sold for cash only to the bidder whose bid in the opinion of the Board of Supervisors will best serve the interests of the owners of land included in the assessment district.

Each bid must state that the bidder offers accrued interest to the date of delivery and state separately the premium, and that the rate of interest offered for the bonds bid for each bid shall be a single rate of interest, and any bid for less than the entire amount of said bonds or for varying rates of interest will be rejected. Any bid for less than the entire amount of interest to date of delivery must provide for an interest rate on the bonds of not less than the maximum rate of six (6) per cent per annum.

Payment for and delivery of bonds will be made in the office of the Board of Supervisors.

A certified or cashier's check for a sum not less than three per cent (3%) of the amount of the bonds, payable to the order of the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors must accompany every bid as a guaranty that the bidder is successful, will accept and pay for the bonds described in the accepted bid in accordance with the terms of his bid, and said check shall remain in the possession of the Board of Supervisors until payment for said bonds has been received. The Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids. The Board also reserves the right to disregard substantial irregularities and technical defects in bids.
