With a family the size of hers, she must spend a lot of time in the kitchen and to keep them well fed and happy she must keep coming up with new recipes that please. Following are a few of the recipes that make into popular dishes at the Miller home.

CHEESE PIE

- 1 Graham Cracker Pie Crust Filling
- 4 small packages cream cheese
- 3 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/2 cup sugar

Combine above ingredients and mix with electric mixer until smooth and completely blended. Place in chilled graham cracker crust and bake in 375 degree oven for 25 minutes. Chill.

Topping

- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
 - 3/4 cup sour cream
 - 2 tablespoons sugar
- Mix cream, sugar, and vanilla and spread over top of chilled pie. Place in 500 degree oven for 5 minutes. Chill in refrigerator for at least 2 hours before serving.

GREEN BEAN CASSEROLE

- 2 cans cream of mushroom soup
- 3 packages frozen green beans
- 2 cans water chestnuts
- 2 cans French fried onion rings

Place green beans in pan with 1 1/2 cups cold water, bring to a boil and boil for 3 minutes. Drain beans and mix with sliced water chestnuts and undiluted mushroom soup. Place in greased casserole and bake in 350 degree oven for 25 minutes. Cover top of casserole with fried onion rings and return to a 400 degree oven for 20 minutes. Serves 8.

CASSEROLE MACROPOLIS

- 2 packages cleaned, deveined, frozen shrimp
- 3 packages frozen scallops
- 2 chopped green peppers
- 1/4-lb. butter
- 1 cup bread crumbs
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 cup cream
- 1/2 cup sherry wine

Thaw shrimp and scallops. Place 1/2 shrimp and scallops in bottom of greased casserole. Sprinkle 1/2 green pepper and bread crumbs over fish. Dot with 1/2 butter and season with salt and pepper. Repeat above procedure, pour cream and sherry wine over top of casserole and bake in 350 degree oven for 50 minutes. Serves 6.

BLEU CHEESE SALAD DRESSING

- 1/4-lb. Bleu cheese
- 3 tablespoons lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire Sauce
- 1/2 cup chopped green onions
- Few grains pepper
- Few grains paprika
- 1 cup mayonnaise

Combine first six ingredients, mash and blend with fork or place in blender, until thoroughly mixed. Add mayonnaise to mixture and refrigerate for at least 3 hours before serving.
