Coffee Name Yates Boss Of Campaign

Douglas Forms New Deployment Division for Weapons Systems

Establishment of a Deployment Division to plan and execute the installation and activation of military weapons systems was announced today by the Douglas Aircraft Company.

The new division has organizational stature equivalent to the other company operating divisions a Santa Monica, Long Beach, El Segundo, Tulsa, and Charlotte, according to President David W. Douglas, Jr.

"IT IS MY belief that the extensive background and experience we have acquired in the installation and activation of weapon systems at both test and operational sites should be concentrated into a specialized division," he declared.

He said that establishment of the new organization will place the company in a position to apply its experience and capability to the deployment of both Douglas-designed and other foreign or domestic locations.

APPOINTED general manager of the new division is W.L. Duval, who will report directly to K. G. Farrar, vice president of manufacturing.

Under his direction, the company served as integrating contractor for the installation of four Thor squadrons (60 missiles) in the United Kingdom.
