"A student of a college or university who after having completed a course of instruction prescribed by this article and successfully passed an examination on the courses required by Section 10051, transfers to another college or university shall not be required to complete another such course or pass an examination as a condition precedent to his graduation from the college or university."

A requirement for the teaching of courses in the principles of state and local government, and American ideals, in addition to American history and other essential subjects was enacted as the result of the introduction of my Assembly Bill No. 3240, which became Chapter 383, Statutes of 1951, and is currently found in Sections 10051, 10052, and 10053, of the Education Code of California. At the request of many teachers and parents I quote the law, which is simply worded and easy to understand as follows:

"SECTION 1. Section 10051 of the Education Code is amended to read:
"10051. In all public and private schools located within the State there shall be given regular courses of instruction in the Constitution of the United States and in American history, including the study of American instituteions and ideals and of the principles of state and local government established under the Constitution of this State.

"20052.
