There are three ways in which foodborne illnesses are usually caused: (1) by means of bacterial contamination resulting in food infection or toxic production; (2) when the food itself is poisonous as in the case of certain mushrooms or (3) by accidenta icontamination of the food with some chemical poison. But most outbreaks of food poisoning, such as the one that recently occurred in a local food poisoning ingicident, are due to bacterial contamination.
