Salmonella Food Poisoning May
Appear in Epidemic Proportions

Gilbert, M.D. Salmonella food infection as prevalent in all countries and may appear in epidemic out of the salmone of the salmone of the disorder have occurred in Los Angels County which in the opinion of health officials, are 360 cases too many. Infection with salmonella for loss of the salmonella food infection with salmonella bacteria may produce several types of illness, but the one more appearance of the salmone of the disease is actually an infection caused by disease-producing or againsm and is not the result of poisoning by a toxin as is the case in food poisoning caused by the result of the staphyloccus.

OUTBREARS of the illness can usually be traced to astimonella-infected foods that are insufficiently cooked or improperly prepared and stored. Often involved are prepared meats, meat ples and sausage, unpasteurized milk and dairy products, and foods containing eggs from infected ducks or hens. Dried egg powder frequently contains live salmonella organisms, so whenever this product is used, cooking should be most thorough.

Another common type of food contamination by salmonella organisms is probably caused most frequently by food infected with the intestinal contents of man, rodents, other animals or fowl.

In an acute attack of the disease may also be spread by infected food handlers who, although apparently in good health, are carriers of the samonella organisms.

SYMPTOMS OF illness vary from mild to severe depending on the amount of infected food, although the incubation period may be longer than the contents of the conten
