## **Auto Industry** Fails to Meet **Smog Challenge**

The automobile industry has completely failed to meet its responsibility to the people of California and particularly Los Angeles County by not providing anti-smog control devices on the exhausts of 1961 model automobiles, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn charged today.

"For the past seven years, since I first wrote to leaders of the automobile industry in February, 1953, the automobile manufacturers have constantly claimed that they have been doing everything in their power to lick this problem and place smog control devices on their cars," he declared.

The automobile industry has spent too much time, money, and energy in providing chrome and fancy gadgets and not nearly enough on developing and perfecting a smog device he continued. vice, he continued

HAHN HAS written to the HAHN HAS written to the president of the major automobile manufacturers in Detroit each year for the past seven years, pointing out the urgency of the smog problem and the need for immediate development of an anti-smog device to be placed on all new cars as they roll off the assembly lines.

"As far as I am concerned, all of the gains which have been made in the past 10 years by controlling industry have been wiped out by the increase in automobiles. Smog is just as bad today as it was 10 years ago," Supeervisor Hahn declared.

HE ADDED that if the automobile industry does not come up with a satisfactory device to be installed on new automobiles, it may be necessary for Congress to pass an interstates commerce law prohibit.




