

Civic Leaders Hail Delivery of First Gas Through New Pipeline

ON THE PRODUCE STANDS ARTICHOKES came into their own in October and November. Quality, so far, has been only fair but expected to improve

Officials from two states to day saluted achievement of an economic milestone—a second major source of natural gas for Southern California.

Gathering at a special luncheon some more of the press from both Texas and California commemorated initial deliveries of natural gas through the recently completed Transwestern Pipeline.

The 1400-mile pipeline, under construction by the Transwestern Pipeline Co. of Houston, Texas for more than a year, links Southern California with vast new supply sources in Oklahoma and Texas.

POINTING UP the importance of this second source of supply, Chamber Vice President Bilheimer, told the more than 600 guests at the luncheon in the Pacific Ballroom of the Statler Hilton Hotel that more than 75 per cent of the gas used in homes and industries here in Southern California is imported from sources out of the state.
