**Normandale Playground Polio Clinic**

Polio immunization will be offered to local residents at Normandale playground, 22400 So. Halldale Ave., under the auspices of the Los Angeles County Medical Ass.

The first inoculation under the "crash inoculation program" will be offered next Thursday, October 6, from 7 p.m. to 9:30 p.m.

The crash program consists of three shots within a six week period. The second shot will be given two weeks after the first, third shot to be given four weeks after the second.

Eligible for these shots are minors under 21 years of age, not married and not in the armed service, and they must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. These polio immunization shots will be \$1 for each shot. A committee of local mothers which include Mmes. John Bankard, James Dossey, Herbert Owens, Charles Burke, Robert Ichekawa, Joe Danford, and Richard Heitmeyer will assist Y.F. Hammett and Gloria Jensen recreation directors at Normandale playground in this Polio immunization program.

Tetanus shots are also offered to interested adults at this time.

"As the population of Southern California continues to grow there is increasing de-

mand for the services offered by the Red Cross Blood Program," declared Mrs. Osborne. "There are many volunteer jobs to be done, but one of the most important is the valuable time donated by our registered nurses."

A wide choice of hours and dates are offered to the volunteer nurses who will be asked to serve once or twice a

month on bloodmobiles in their own neighborhood. Volunteer nurses living from Torrance and Gardena to the beach cities are needed.

Registered nurses who are assigned to Red Cross bloodmobiles are asked to take the medical histories, blood pressure, and temperature of prospective blood donors.
