



Editor, Torrance Herald I cannot commend them who attack the Torrance school board for its obvious short-comings in matters of taxation and academic philosophy by voting "no" for teachers salaries and educational materials! Their real argument is with the waste in construction, not in the cost of salaries, materials, and aids, salaries, materials, and aids. Their disagreement is with the Board's educational philosophy, not with the teach-

We now have four high schools with a fifth proposed. Using the Board's own fig-ures, the expected high school enrollment, at saturation, is just under 10,000 students. I would seriously question the existence of an Eastern city with more than two high schools to satisfy such an enrollment figure! Eastern cities built upwards long before land values reached the level currently in Torreport

I do not proposate discuss the frills and fads in school construction. I will challenge, however, the type of thinking involved which causes a school to be built on good taxable commercial property adjoining a major highway as in the case of South High School. This was a poor site academically and a great loss to the city in future sales taxes and real property taxes. Even if we were to grant the argument that our schools should be beautiful and are all necessary, can we be content with the end result of good families, i.e., the academic quality of our graduates? Can we be content with the results of this so-called "progressive education?" The school board tries to make a case by comparing our product with that of eight called contents. case by comparing our product with that of other Cali-fornia school districts. We measure progress by comprisons, we make it only by tablishing future goals. Further, if comparisons are to ne valid, they should be made with Eastern schools as well!

The real argument is with the construction program. The irresponsible waste in this program has brought us to our limits in taxation and it promises to continue. Further, the question is wether our classrooms and the children of Torrance will continue to be used as laboratories and instruments for every progressive notion to come progressive notion to come from the fuzzy-minded so-called liberals on the current school board.
