Principal speaker was Rev. Mother Francoise, Mother Superior of the Marymount High School. After a welcoming address, she outlined the problems facing today's students, parents and faculty.

MOTHER Francoise stressed the fact that more is demanthe fact that more is deman-ded of today's student, neces-sitating an even more thorough preparation than ever before. It is vital, she said, that stu-dents have a wider and more intensive knowledge and devel-op more maturity of judg-ment

Marymount's Principal laid down the factors which they believe to be most important in the intellectual preparation students. The first category he listed was individual character traits. Among these character traits are perserverance, self-sacrifice and the intelligance to be guided.

LATTER trait she amplified as the intelligence to allow one-self to be guided by the teacher in order to reach educational achievement. Self sacrifice was defined as the character trait which is displayed when the student sacrifices less important but mo re desirable things in order to pursue those things which will help to educate and develop the student more fully.

The second category outlined by Rev. Mother Francoise was study habits, which she declared as of vital importance in a student's developement.

THE THREE necessary brackets in study habits are self reliance, organization and concentration is harder than ever to achieve in today's world.

It is impossible she asserted, for today's student to concentrate properly with records, radio or television playing. Many students believe these distracions not harmful to them, she said, whereas it is proven that nothing succeeds like the kind of quiet, steady concentration without distraction that brings the most benefits to study.

THE THRD category discussed by Marymount's Principal was the native ability of the student. Each student's native ability is individually his or hers. She maintained that one useless practice is to consider that because one child
