Cigarette Tax Nets \$65 Million **During First Year, State Finds**

Total receipts from the cigarette tax during the first year ended June 30, 1960, including the floor stocks tax and revenue collected in advance of cigarettes. Post expression of stamps and meter settings, amounted to \$65,230,184 according to Richard Nevins, Fourth District member of the State Board of Equalization.

This total includes a non-recurring floor stocks tax of \$2.7 million collected from re-tailers on cigarettes in their possession when the tax be-

possession when the tax became effective on July 1, 1959.

NEVINS POINTED out that the tax is prepaid by licensed distributors who purchase stamps or pay for metered impressions which are affixed to each package before they are sold to retailers. On June 30, 1960, there were 286 such distributors in California.

Sales were well above expenses.

Sales were well above ex-pectations despite the new tax, Nevins stated. Taxable sales to retailers by licensed distribu-tors amounted to nearly 42 billion cigarettes during the 1959-60 Fiscal Year or an es-timated 210 packs for every
