Much less frequently hepatitis is spread by the use of im-properly sterilized needles, syringes and other instruments soiled with blood containing the hepatitis virus.

ILLNESS IS NOT usually evident until about 25 days after infection. On occasion, it arter infection. On occasion, it may be as short as 10 days or as long as 50. The period of immunity conferred by an attack is not definitely known but is probably lifelong.

## Stop and Look! It Still Goes At Railroads

A flashing red signal, a warning bell — but the car streaks across the tracks any

It's an invitation to disaster. And it's also a violation of the vehicle code, points out California Highway Patrol Commissioner Bradford M. Crittenden.

The law states that when-

ever a "clearly visible electric or mechanical signal device gives warning of the immediate approach" of a train, the "driver of a vehicle shall stop with-in 50 feet but not less than 10

feet from the nearest track of the railway."

"The law is very clear — it calls for a full stop whenever you approach a railway cross-ing warning device which is in operation," the commissioner said

said.

After a full stop, the driver can proceed if the crossing can be made safely.

"Without a full stop, the driver is too busy watching the roadway and other motor vehicles to observe the train and gauge its distance and speed.

"When you make a complete stop, you can then look for the train and make an accurate judgement on whether to pro-

judgement on whether to proceed or wait for the train to pass," the commissioner said.
