Sgt. Forsythe Attends Police Course at State

Sgt. Donald Forsyth, of 23747 Falena Ave., has completed a five-session Police Supervisory Institute at Los Angeles State College.

Forsyth, a member of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, was among 150 law officers from throughout Southern California who attended the training program for first-line law enforcement leaders.

Purpose of the institute, sponsored by the Los Angeles State College Department of Police Science and Administration in cooperation with local law enforcement agencies, was to provide present and potential police leaders with the latest information on first-line supervisory techniques.

Faculty included officers from various Southern California law enforcement agencies and police administration instructors from Los Angeles State College and UCLA. Allen P. Bristow, Assistant Professor of Police Administration at LASC, was chairman.

Final day-long session met Wednesday on the State College campus. A second police institute, on burglary investigation, commences at State College next week.

He admitted having been weakened by the 91-day ordeal, although he said he managed to keep his normal weight by eating good food donated by Anchor Restaurant located on Redondo Pier.

WHILE ATOP the pole, his voice became well-known on Radio Station KTYM through his daily, telephoned weather forecasts. He was heard on other radio programs, too, and over the months conversed by telephone with thousands of Southland residents.
