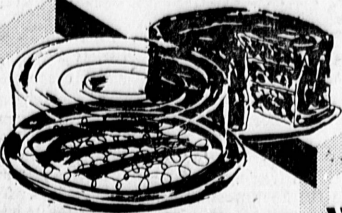

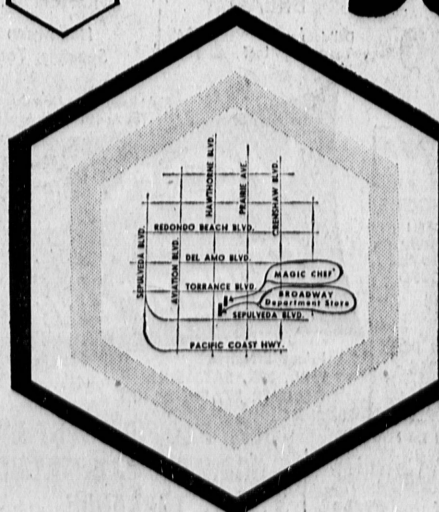

## Realtor Heads Committee for Area Scout Fete

William "Bill" Dunlap, Gardena and Rolling Hills realtor, has been appointed chairman of the reception committee for the Annual Harbor Area Recognition Dinner of the Los Angeles Boy Scout Council, according to General Chairman George A. Bradford.

The event is scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 9 at the San Pedro Hacienda Hotel with over 300 Scout and civic leaders from San Pedro, Wilmington, Lomita, Harbor City, Gardena, and Torrance expected to attend.

He has been responsible for sustaining membership goals for the Harbor District and is rated as one of the area's hardest working scouting executives.

## Board Names Architect for 2 New Schools

Architect Roy Donley was commissioned to draw up plans for two new Torrance elementary schools in the WALTERIA Lake area, under action taken by the Board of Education Tuesday.

Plans will be drawn for a school near 227th and Ladeens Ave. and for another site further south near Ocean Ave. The schools will serve a huge new tract development in that area. Donley previously has drawn plans for a number of other Torrance schools.

In other action, the board also commissioned Donley to draw plans for a Child Care Center. These facilities are paid for out of Child Care funds and not from local taxes.

"The Magnificent Seven," a film set in 16th Century Japan, will open the 1960-61 movie program of the Torrance Recreation Department and Los Angeles County Museum.

Showings of the widely-acclaimed motion picture are slated for 7 and 8:45 p.m. Friday in the Council Chamber of City Hall, 3031 Torrance Blvd.

The film portrays medieval Japanese village's heroic defense against a band of bandits. Admission is free, but the movie is not recommended for children.

Planned next month is a documentary film on Russia.
