## King Letting Area Down in Congress, Coffee Charges

Congress, Coffee Charges

The 17th Congressional District, often referred to as the "Missile Minded Mile in America," for 18 years has had no representation in the House of Representatives, charged Tom Coffee, Republican candidate for Congress.

He made the statement during a talk Monday at the Town Hall Forum, 810 West 120th St., Inglewood. In charging the lack of representation, he referred to incumbent Cecil King, who is not a member of any one of six Congressional committees whose actions affect the aircraft industry and everyone in the South Bay area.

Coffee pointed out that other Congressmen are using their influence to move the aircraft industry to other districts. He cited the recent efforts of Senator Javisto (D-NY) in his effort to move the bulk of the industry east.

"ONLY RECENTLY," said Coffee, "Rep. Henry Sheppard (D) of San Bernardino got the Air Force to move a large portion of its Ballistic Missile Division in Inglewood to San Bernardino County. Everyone but Cecil King is fighting the move."

## Garden Checklist

- 1. Continue to dig gladiolus as the tops yellow off. Leaving them to winter over will only increase their chances of attracting thrips.
- 2. Use pots of Chrysanthemums in bloom to brighten a drab decker to bring festive fall colors into
- 3. Sow spring-flowering Sweet Peas. Dig a good deep trench and layer manure at the bottom. Then add a layer of top-soil and the seed.
- 4. Spring flowering bulbs still top your planting list this week. Daffodils, Tulips, Hyacinths - all of them can go in.
- 5. Continue to rake fallen leaves and mulch them if you have the space for it. If you don't, burn them, especially if your plants are subject to mildew, rust, or common plant diseases.
