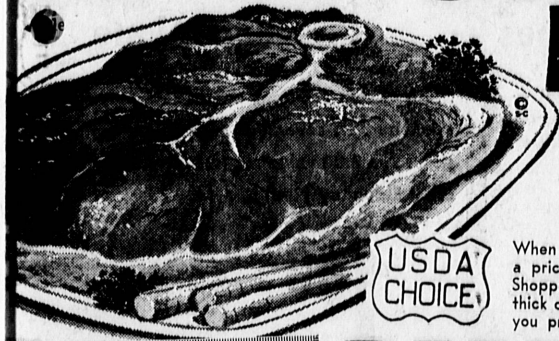

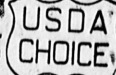

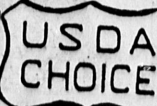

Church of Religious Science

Breaks Ground for New Edifice

Three hundred members and friends of the Redondo-Torrance Church of Religious Science attended a consecration and groundbreaking ceremony Sunday on the site of their new church at Knob Hill and Prospect Ave. Youth of the church, represented by John Robbins and Suzanne Hiatt, made the presentation of the colors, and Dr. Earl D. Bar-

num, minister, gave the dedication address.

Master of ceremonies Albert I. Lukes, vice president of the board of trustees, read a congratulatory telegram from Dr. Raymond Charles Barker of New York, president of the International Assn. of Religious Science Churches, and stated that many such messages had been received.

AMONG THE special guests introduced by Lukes were Rabbi Henri Front of Temple Menorah, who spoke briefly as representative of the South Bay Ministerial Assn.; Dr. and Mrs. Jesse Longe of Inglewood church; Dr. and Mrs. Charles H. Palmer of Los Angeles East Side church; John Henry, manager of the Redondo branch of Home Bank, and Mrs. Henry; E. J. Champion, local realtor and member of the board of directors of the Home Bank; Charles W. Wallace of the C. W. Driver and Co., general contractors, and Mrs. Wallace; Howard Van Heuklyn, associate of Risley and Gould, architects, and Mrs. Van Heuklyn.

THE FIRST spadeful of earth was turned by Doyace L. Miller, building chairman, followed by Albert I. Lukes and Lester Fuller, members of the board of trustees.

Dr. Barnum pronounced the benediction after those assembled sang the Lord's Prayer, led by Arthur Hopkins and the church choir.

Construction of the first unit of the master plan will start early this month.



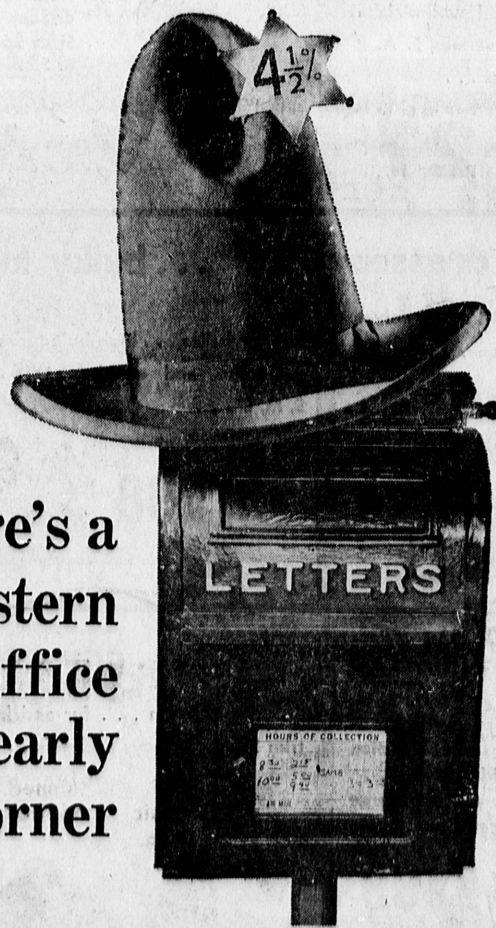
