Sad Montgomery Points to Season Ending Grid Win

Bishop Montgomery High football coach George Gaunder must have felt like the fighter who was knocked out from his own punch Thursday after Alemany scored a 13-6 Camino Real League victory.

Although outplayed and outgained in the statistical department, Alemany looked best on the scoreboard after converting two intercepted passes into sensational touchdown plays.

Alemany stunned Montgomery in the first quarter on a 76 yard runback and again in the third period, on a 40 yard interception return.

THE LOSS was Montgomery's fifth in a row, and the Knights' are still winless in Camino Real League activity. This week the Torrance school will end its season in San Pedro, meeting Mary Star of the Sea.

If statistics are any consolation, Montgomery has had a successful season. But its touchdowns, not first downs that win games, so the Knights are saddled with a 2-6 record in their first season of competition with seniors.

Against Alemany, a San Fernando Valley school, Montgomery led in total yards, 186 to 43 and in first downs, nine to six.

BUT THE Knights didn't cut through Alemany's defense until the fourth quarter, when halfback Dick Moore plunged over from a foot out to cap a 49 yard march in six plays.

OFF AND RUNNING by John I. Day The Richest Race of All



Early American racing was under match conditions, the owners putting up "so much a side" in money, cotton, tobacco, land, or even the horse. The track was a field, a road, or perhaps the main street in town which in some cities, Philadelphia, for instance, is still known as Race Street. Later, when tracks were laid out and meetings organized, prize money, in races other than Sweepstakes, was hung in a purse in the winner's circle. Owners still run for each other's money in Stakes races, putting up fees for each entry, but today the racetrack adds something to the pot. This "Added money" ranges from a few thousand to \$150,000 in the case of the Preknack at Pimlico, and, in all but one notable exception, makes up the bulk of the prize. Oddly enough, the richest race in the world, the Garden State, at Garden State Park near Camden, N.J., does not offer the most added money. An event for 2-year-olds, on the last Saturday in October each year, it is run under "futurity" conditions. Horses are nominated as yearlings, and an ultimate starter's fees total \$2,565.
