City Maintains Strong Third in **Building Values**

Torrance continued to main-tain a strong third place among Los Angeles County cities in building permit valu-ations with the compilation of 10-month figures by the Tor-rance Chamber of Commerce. Total valuations for the first 10 months of 1960 indicate that Torrance is near the \$31 mil-

Torrance is near the \$31 mil-lion mark, an increase of \$4 million over the total for 1959, the Chamber report stated. October permits in Torrance totaled \$1,470,192, an increase of \$240,000 over permits a

year ago.

Los Angeles continued to pace the field with a permit valuation of \$520 million, down valuation of \$520 million, down \$45 million from the 1959 figure, Long Beach ranked sec-ond and Beverly Hills fourth.
