He urged that the legislative program, in addition to twe program, in addition to imposing penalties severe enough to take peddlers off the streets and to eliminate their huge profits from selling narcotics, should include a provision for compulsory medical treatment of addicts — particularly teen age addicts.

"WHEN A person is afflicted with tuberculosis and is a danger to others but refuses to be treated either by his own doctor or at Olive View San-itarium, the County Health Officer is empowered to secure a court order to compel that person to be treated. If he still refuses, he can be committed to the Mira Loma facility for recalcitrant patients," Hahn

He added that it is just as important to protect the public against narcotics as it is against tuberculosis.

"I am confident that 1961 will be the turning point in California and that with the enactment of strong, new laws, the problem will be licked ithin a short time," he concluded.
