Long Beach Slightly Favored Over Tyler in Saturday's Jr. Rose Bowl

"We're looking for the toughest game we've played," maintained the Long Beach City College's football coach, Jim Stangeland.
The Vikings will battle Tyler, Texas, Saturday at 1:30 p.m. in the Junior Rose Bowl in Pasadena. While the Vikes went undefeated in nine contests, the Apaches swept past 12 foes.

Observers are predicting a

battle of Tyler power against Long Beach explosiveness. Of the 3588 yards gained by Tyler, only 791 was through the air. Meanwhile, 1227 of Long Beach's 3455 total yards came through the air lanes.

Top rusher for Tyler was Henry Boxley, who gained 667 yards with 137 carries for a 4.9 average. Outside of LBCC slotback Willie Mar-BCC slotback Willie Mar-tin (119 yards in 14 carries for an 8.4 average), two Viking ball carriers have better

rushing averages. Fullback Lonzo Irvin (who missed two Lonzo Irvin (who missed two games) gained 885 yards in 135 carries for a 6.5 average. Halfback Dee Andrews picked up 860 yards in 134 carries for a 6.4 average. Irvin led Long Beach scorers with 14 touchdowns and three conversions as compared to quarterback Jimmy Lyons of the Apaches who scored 12 touchdowns and two points after to pace his team.
