Release of the last of 11,202 drawings was on the scheduled date set three years ago when the program first was activated, stated Jack Jones, Vice President and B-70 Manager for North American. "It is significant because it means construction of this steel and titanium airplane can proceed on schedule."

JONES SAID the more than eleven thousand drawings represented a total of 'over 6,000,000 engineering manhours including almost 10,000 hours of wind tunnel testing that has gone into the design and development of what he termed the "greatest airplane ever conceived."

### Garden Checklist
