Bishop Warner To Talk About Tours in Africa

Bishop Ira D. Warner will be speaking nightly, Jan. 18 through 29, 7:30 p.m. at Hope Evangelical United Brethren Church, 3343 W. 174th St., in a series of evangelistic lectures, the Rev. Monrad Bergesen, pastor, announced.

Bishop Ira D. Warner is a native of Ohio, headquarters of Evangelical United Brethren Church. Upon graduation from Otterbein College he took a mission church in Chattanooga, Tenn. His first pastorate was First Church in Akron, Ohio.

Bishop Warner was elected Bishop and assigned to the Pacific area in 1929. His leadership has resulted in some of the greatest growth of Evangelical United Brethren Church.
