For Bakersfield, Steve Merta bounced in a total of 20. SUMMARY

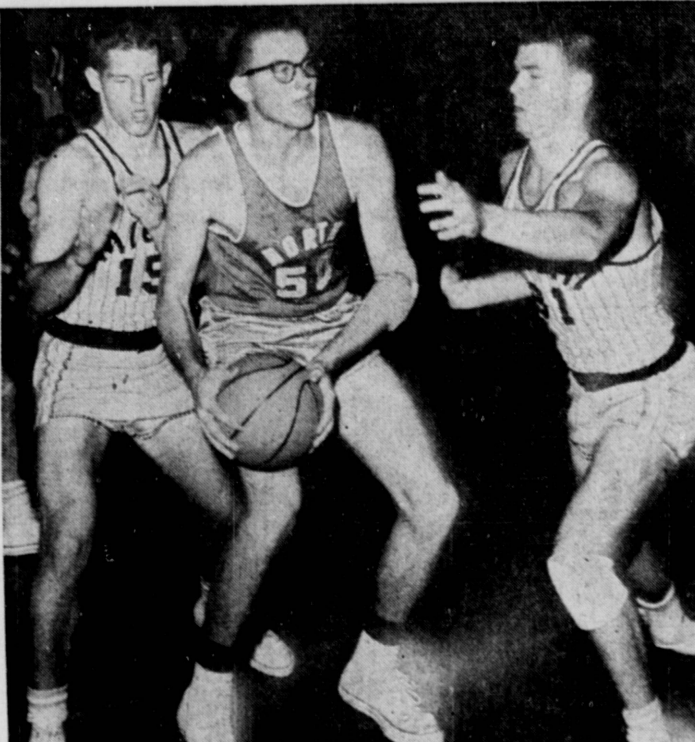
