Thor Puts 'Big Punch' in U.S. Rocket Launches Again in 1960

Thor put the "big punch" into the United States space exploration program during 1960, blasting 14 of the nation's 16 satellite successes into orbit.
 As in 1959, when the "Thor-score" was 7 of 11, the reliable Douglas Aircraft Co.-built rocket again paced the U.S. space advance, orbiting more than two tons of scientific instrumentation.
 DURING 1960, seven of the Thor-boosted satellites were launched from pads at Cape Canaveral. These included Transit 1B and Transit 2A navigation-aid satellites, Pioneer V solar-orbiting satellite, Tiro I and Tiro II weather-watching satellites, the Echo passive communications satellite and the Courier 1B active communications satellite.
 From Vandenberg Air Force Base, Thor blasted seven Discoverer satellites into space. Out of six attempts last year by the Air Force to recover these satellites from orbit, four were successful.
 THE OTHER two satellite triumphs by the U.S. during 1960 were Midas II an Atlas-Agena launch, and Explorer VIII, launched by a Juno II rocket.

The 21 satellites placed into orbit in 1959-60 by Thor-boosted vehicles have traveled an estimated 1,288,000,000 miles through the depths of space. In terms of weight and distance, these satellites have chalked up a total of almost 117,000,000 ton-miles.
 In all, Thor was fired 26 times during 1960, including five training launches from Vandenberg by Royal Air Force crews.
 TWENTY-ONE of the 26 were rated successful, for a reliability of 80 per cent. Included in the 21 were two satellite launches that failed because of malfunctions in upper stages.
 Since its "crash" development as an Air Force intermediate range ballistic missile, Thor has "gone to bat" on 108 occasions, including 49 research and development firings, 43 space launches and 16 training shots.
 IN ALL, Thor has functioned flawlessly in 34 of its 43 space assignments, including 27 scientific space projects and seven re-entry test firings of experimental nose cones.

Thor, in production at the Douglas Santa Monica Division, has been tabbed for additional Discoverer, Delta and Transit launches. In addition, the rocket has been selected by NASA as the first stage of the vehicles that will launch the Nimbus series of meteorological satellites and the polar orbiting geophysical observatory spacecraft.
 IN EACH of its space launches, the versatile Thor has been teamed with one or two upper stages to reach the velocity required for orbit.
 These 1960 combinations included the Agena A and Agena B rockets in the Discoverer series, the Able-Star vehicle for the Transit and Courier launches, the Able for the Tiro I and the Delta for the Echo and Tiro II projects.
