The guild's next meeting will be held Feb. 8 at noon at the home of Mrs. J. Miller, 26292 Delos Dr.

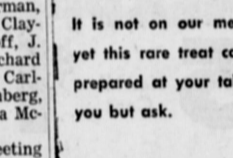

Mrs. Sune Richards, Artist, Will Be AAUW Speaker

A program that has been described as "unique, interesting, and inspiring" will be presented to the members of the Palos Verdes-Rolling Hills branch of the American Association of University Women at their general meeting in the Palos Verdes Library today when Mrs. Harry G. Peterson, Creative Arts chairman, introduces Mrs. Sune Richards as speaker of the evening.

Mrs. Richards is the creator of a group of pictures representing the 12 Disciples; and so well has she chosen the subjects for her camera, and so skillfully has she posed them and later colored the pictures with special opaque oils, that her work brought her a special citation from the Professional Photographers of America.

A sincerely religious woman, she was first inspired to begin her portrayals of the Disciples when she noticed an old man sitting opposite her in a bus. He wore a flowing beard in the Biblical tradition that made her think he looked like Simon, one of the Disciples of Christ. When he reached his stop she followed him from the bus and asked him to pose for her. Thus started her "Search of the Disciples", which is the theme of her talk. "Andrew" was found directing a program in a television studio. She found a model for Nathaniel in a young machinist walking in a Milwaukee park. "Phillip" was a young Egyptian studying Diesel engineering.

Thus her search continued, until the final set of portraits have been termed "a memorable achievement climaxing a 10 year quest."

A coffee hour, set for 7:30, under the direction of Mrs. Robert W. Montgomery, and a short business meeting conducted by branch President Mrs. Donald Limerick, will precede the program by Mrs. Richards.
