

Warriors Face San Diego at Border City in Metro Clash

San Diego's JC's Knights will provide southern hospitality Friday evening when Coach George Stanich's El Camino College Warriors travel to the Border City for an important Metropolitan Conference basketball clash.

Led by league scoring leader Art "Hambone" Williams, the Scarlet and White will go into the game favored over the visiting tribe.

SAN DIEGO tied for the league crown with Bakersfield last season only to lose in the play-off game, largely because their star, Williams, was found ineligible. This year Williams and supporting cast are back in full swing, which means a night of just too many Knights for El Camino.

In prior years El Camino has managed only to salvage a mediocre 11 of 27 games against San Diego. Already this season the Knights have defeated the best JC team in California, Fullerton, which in-

dicates the strength of the Southlanders.

FRIDAY the 13th lived up to its ominous reputation for El Camino, as the Warriors were outplayed by a band of East L.A. Huskies to the tune of 90-80. Cold from the floor during the first half and never quite as hot as the Huskies, the Warriors lost their second in three conference tries.

The band box, junior high school gymnasium which East L.A. must call home, seemed to throw El Camino during the early moments, but the Warriors came back in the second half to bucket 50 points only to have the red hot Huskies net 55.

THE VICTORY left the surprising East L.A. team undisputed conference leaders after three games. In pre-season Sam Barry Tournament competition, El Camino outscored the Huskies 88-71 but it was a much improved, rugged team

the Warriors faced Friday. Six men scored for East L.A., all of them in double figures. Leading scorer for El Camino was Indiana transplant, Center Ron Wey, who scored 26, 18 in the second half. Tough forward Joe Cattivera followed closely with 19.

EAST L.A.'s fast break in the latter part of the game kept the Huskies just out of reach of the Warriors. During the second half only two to four points separated the two teams much of the time, but East L.A. men broke free for long passes and easy shots to put the encounter in the bag.
