King Names 4 As Nominees to US Air Academy

Two young men from Torrance and two from Lomitz were among the 11 named this week by Congressman Cecil R. King (D-Cal) to take competitive examinations for appointment to the 1961 class of the U. S. Air Force Academy.

Torrance men named included Jay Lawrence Lippman, 3813 W. 184th Place, and David Blair Kratzer, 25941 Richville Drive.

Lomita men included William Loyd Tenney, 25849 Appian Way, and Hugo Victor Heiner, 25428 Pennsylvania Ave.

Others named included two from Palos Verdes Estates, three from Los Angeles, and one each from Wilmington and Inglewood.

Congressman King said the nominees will compete for a place in the next class of the



Air Force Academy that will number 770 young men from all of the 50 states who will be uniformly above average . . . morally, physically, and scholastically.

The College Entrance Examination Board tests, the Air Force Officer Qualifying Test, a physical aptitude examination, and the Academy medical examination will determine which young men are best qualified for appointment, he said.
