Dutch Van Leeuwen, Bellflowers "Flying Dutchman" and winner of 24 straight TT races during 1960, will be back determined to score his first expert class victory. The Ascot TT course, which utilizes the infield as well as parts of the regulation half-mile saucer, measures six-tenths of a mile with nine sharp turns and a hazardous 10-foot barrier.

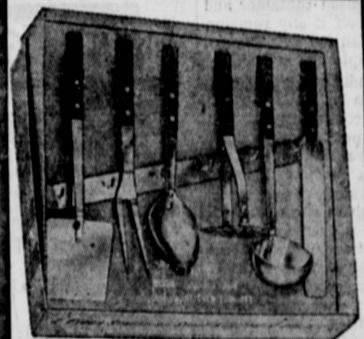
