THIS competition is particularly important, O'Brien said, in view of the restrictive effect of air pollution controls on the fuel market in South-

ern California. He was referr-

ring to a Los Angeles County rule restricting the use of fuel oil during six months of the year and voluntary suspension of fuel burning when smoggy conditions are forecast.

He said that the new gas supplies will increase the total use of gas in the area by mak-

ing the gas Edison is using available to other interruptible customers for their plants.

mer Federal Power Commissioner, testified that the new pipeline "will contribute toward solving the West Coast's energy problems and will help in the efforts to obtain stability of price and small for

in the efforts to obtain sta-bility of price and supply for both gas and electric utilities for some time to come." Connole said the project will make gas supplies available to Southern California under a longitern commitment as a supplier to the supplier of the suppli

Southern California under a long-term commitment, at predictable prices, that heretofore have not been available to the area "and probably, but for this project, never would become available except under much less favorable conditions."

HE NOTED that at present California is unique—the only state in the union—in which there is no interstate natural

gas pipeline that brings gas beyond the border. "The impact on the Edison

"The impact on the Edison Company is especially severe," he pointed out, "because Edison is confronted with a variety of pressures to purchase great quantities of gas during certain periods of the year, irrespective to whether the price and other contract provisions are agreeable to it."

CONCERNING the Mexican portion of the pipeline, he stid, "I consider the net effect to be a distinct advantage to the customers of Edison and to the entire Southern California accord market."
