Marinated Beans

- 1 large white onion, sliced and in rings
- 1 can good quality green beans
- 1 can good quality wax

(yellow) beans

- 1 can red kidney beans
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 2 cup Mazola oil
- 2 cup wine vinegar
- 1 teasp. paprika
- Dash Worcestershire
- Dash pepper
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 clove garlic, minced
- 1 teasp. lemon juice

Mix all ingredients in a large bowl, and allow to marinate at least 24 hours, in refrigerator. Serve cold or hot.
