TH 63 AN ORDINANCE NO. 1215 OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE ADDING ARTICLE III TO CHAPTER 13 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE ACCEPTING THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 13.22 OF THE PENAL CODE RELATIVE TO TRAINING OFFICERS. The City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows: SECTION 1. Article III is hereby added to Chapter 13 of the Code of the City of Torrance to read in its entirety as follows: "Article III. Aid for Training of Law Enforcement Officers. Section 13.22. Qualifying for aid. The City of Torrance declares that it desires to qualify to receive aid from the State of California under the provisions of Chapter 1 of Title 4 of the California Penal Code. Section 23.1. Adherence to standards. Pursuant to Section 13.22 of Chapter 1 of Title 4 of the California Penal Code, the City of Torrance while receiving aid from the State of California under the provisions of Chapter 1 of Title 4 of the California Penal Code, shall adhere to the standards for recruitment and training as set forth in the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training. SECTION 2. Any provision of the Torrance City Code, or appendices thereto, inconsistent herewith, to the extent of such inconsistency and no further are hereby repealed. SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its adoption and prior to the expiration of fifteen days from the passage thereof shall be published at least once in the Torrance Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper of general circulation published and circulated in the City of Torrance. TH 62 AN ORDINANCE NO. 1216 OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE ADDING ARTICLE IV TO CHAPTER 13 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE RELATIVE TO THE SAME SUBJECT MATTER. The City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows: SECTION 1. That Article IV of Chapter 13 of the Code of the City of Torrance, is hereby amended to read as follows: "Article IV. Collection and Disposal of Rubbish and Garbage. Section 13.60. Definitions. A. 'Occupant' shall include, but shall not be limited to, any person who is in possession of or who is the inhabitant of a residence. B. 'Residence' shall mean a single family residence, a two family residence, one of two single family residences on one lot, and any other dwelling house permitted in zones R-1 or R-2 by the provisions of the Official Land Use Ordinance (Appendix I of this Code). C. 'Rubbish' shall include animal, fruit and vegetable refuse and of: 1. 'Rubbish' shall include garbage, combustible rubbish and non-combustible rubbish. E. 'Combustible rubbish' shall include paper, leaves, Christmas trees, chips, grass, pastboard, carpets, clothing, magazines, books, straw, packing material, barrels, boxes, crates, cartons and all other similar articles or materials which will burn by contact with flames of ordinary temperature, which are rejected by the owner or producer thereof as worthless or useless. F. 'Non-combustible rubbish' shall include ashes, broken glass and crockery bottles, tin cans and containers, metals and all other similar articles or materials other than combustible rubbish or garbage, which are rejected by the owner or producer thereof as worthless or useless. SECTION 13.61. Right to contract. Notwithstanding the provisions of sections 13.62 and 13.63, any occupant shall have the right to remove and dispose of or contract for the removal and disposal of his own rubbish as otherwise provided by law, but the exercise of such right shall not relieve such occupant from the obligation to pay the city the rubbish fee as provided in section 13.69. SECTION 13.62. Time of collection. A. The director of public works

shall provide for and supervise the collection and removal of rubbish at least once each week from all residences in the city as defined in section 13.60. B. The director of public works may establish routes, days and hours for collection of rubbish and may change the same from time to time when in his opinion it becomes necessary or proper. SECTION 13.63. Manner of collection. The director of public works shall make such rules not inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter 13 as may be necessary and proper to effect the collection and removal of rubbish from the city. C. Except as provided in subsection C of this section 13.62, the director of public works shall collect and remove only that rubbish which has been placed for collection in the receptacles of the type or kind prescribed by the provisions of this chapter. C. In all cases where, in the opinion of the director of public works, a difficulty exists in complying with the requirements of this chapter for the collection of rubbish for collection, he shall designate where the same shall be deposited, provided, however, that he may refuse to have collected any materials or quantities which, in his opinion, are too large for collection. SECTION 13.64. Prohibited placement of receptacles. No person shall place or cause to be placed any rubbish or rubbish receptacle on a street or alley at any place or in any manner other than as provided in this chapter, or at any place other than on the days established by the director of public works for collection of rubbish on any route or after 6:00 o'clock p.m. on the days immediately prior to such collection, or at any place other than that specified in this chapter. SECTION 13.65. Combination of garbage and rubbish. A. Each person shall place in one receptacle all garbage, combustible rubbish and non-combustible rubbish for collection by the city. B. No occupant shall place any garbage or rubbish for collection unless it is wrapped in newspaper or placed in a paper bag. SECTION 13.66. Period of accumulation limited. No person shall cause or permit combustible rubbish to accumulate at any place or premises under his control for a period in excess of seven days, or permit or allow non-combustible rubbish to accumulate at any place or premises in excess of thirty days. SECTION 13.67. Common receptacles prohibited. A. Each person accumulating or producing rubbish shall provide his own receptacle for depositing or accumulating the same. B. No person shall set out for collection by the city any receptacle which is common to two or more residences. C. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any combustible rubbish in a receptacle of a residence with which he is not directly connected. SECTION 13.68. Storing rubbish prohibited. No person shall deposit or bury any rubbish in the city unless it is covered and covered, and unless written permission to do so has been obtained from the health officer and the director of public works. SECTION 13.69. Fees established. A. This city council hereby finds and determines that the periodic collection of rubbish from all residences in the city benefits all residents and therefore all such occupants are made liable for the payment to the city of the rubbish collection fee of \$1.00 per month. B. This city council hereby finds and determines that the city government is unable to provide adequate and economical garbage collection and disposal services for industrial and commercial establishments, institutions, apartment houses, and buildings other than residences as defined in section 13.60 herein, and therefore the periodic collection of rubbish by the city government will not be made a part of such services and premises except residences as defined in said section 13.60. SECTION 13.70. Collection of fees. A. Bills for rubbish collection fees shall be rendered approximately each month for the two month period preceding the date of the bill. B. Bills shall be due and payable on the day following the date of the bill. C. Bills shall be delinquent on the sixteenth day following the date of the bill. D. Bills may be rendered approximately each ninety days at the discretion of the Director of Finance. E. Bills for rubbish collection fees may be incorporated into the bills rendered for domestic water service and in such case the date of the bill shall be the date on which the water service bill is rendered. F. It shall be the duty and function of the director of finance to administer this section. SECTION 13.71. Deposits. A. A deposit of \$2.00 may be required of any occupant whenever, in the opinion of the director of public works, such deposit is necessary to insure prompt and satisfactory payment of rubbish collection fees. B. In making such deposit, having to his credit a deposit for rubbish service shall, for any reason, discontinuing such service, the deposit shall first be applied to any rubbish fees remaining unpaid and any remaining balance of the deposit shall be refunded. SECTION 13.72. Delegation of authority. The director of public works may delegate to the owners and duties conferred on him by this article to any officer or employee of the city, but in such event the director of public works shall remain responsible for the proper performance thereof. SECTION 2. Any provision of the Torrance City Code, or appendices thereto, inconsistent herewith, to the extent of such inconsistency and no further, are hereby repealed. SECTION 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be subject to a fine not exceeding Five Hundred dollars and/or imprisonment (6) months in the County Jail of Los Angeles County, or by both such punishment and imprisonment in the discretion of the court. SECTION 4.
