boundary changes. A LOCAL citizens committee headed by Attorney Boris S. Woolley, a committee of attorneys headed by President Lowell Dryden of the South Bay Bar Assn., and the Torrance city council are heading up efforts to have the multi-judge court located in Torrance.

"Inasmuch as Torrance is now becoming the hub of activity in the entire Southwest County area and will become more so in years to come, it is only natural that it become the center of the county activities in this area," Mayor Albert Isen said in summing up Torrance's stand.

With the Harbor, San Diego and other projected freeways serving this area, along with the projected opening soon of Del Amo Blvd. as an expressway, and Artesia Blvd. already completed as an expressway, Torrance will be as accessible as any city in the county, local officials say.

YMCA Kicks Off Drive To Meet \$35,500 Budget

The Torrance YMCA announced the 1961 current support campaign goal and key leadership today. The local youth agency will seek \$35,500 to carry on its work with over 6000 boys and girls in Torrance, Lomita and Riviera during 1961.

Mayor Albert Isen has accepted the task of General Campaign Chairman for the fourth consecutive year. Division Chairmen working with Isen are: James A. Davis, Century Club; Marshall Stewart, Industry; Louis Schlanger, Commerce; Stanley Remel-meyer, Professions; and Rod Swartz, Parents.

THE ANNUAL YMCA drive will be launched with a kick-off breakfast this Saturday morning from 7:30 until 9 a.m. at the International House of Pancakes. The en-

tertaining event is open to all citizens without advance reservations. More than 200 volunteer campaigners will receive instructions during the program.

The Torrance YMCA campaign is the largest annual fund-raising event in the city, and all funds collected remain in the community to maintain more than 115 youth clubs meeting regularly and underwrite 15 separate sessions of summer camp for local boys and girls. The YMCA's entire operating budget is attained through this drive, since the agency is not a recipient of Chest funds.

STARTING with boys or girls six years old, the local YMCA conducts varied programs of education, recreation, training and fun for all ages through high school and

college. In addition, to the popular youth programs, more than 1900 families are enrolled in various YMCA family programs. A full-time staff of three professional youth workers is augmented by five trained part-time program directors.

More than 3000 families and firms will be contacted in

an effort to finance the YMCA adequately despite a cloudy economic climate. The Torrance YMCA campaign operated in 1960 for 3.7% of its goal, the lowest campaign cost of all Southland drives.

FOLLOWING the breakfast Saturday, YMCA kids will disperse in many directions for Y fun: Littlest children will board buses for an excursion to Knott's Berry Farm; 200 boys will play in the YMCA basketball leagues that morning; and teenagers will travel to the mountains and desert for week-end outings.
