#### Stew With Dumplings

1 diced potato

1 tablespoon salt

1/2 teaspoon pepper

½ teaspoon garlic salt

2 lbs. beef chuck, cubed 1 large onion, diced

- 4-6 carrots, quartered
- 2 cups celery, sliced
- 1 package frozen green

1 teaspoon paprika Lightly flour beef cubes. Brown meat on all sides in hot fat. Add onion, seasonings, and 2 cups hot water; simmer one hour. Then add carrots, celery, liquid as required; continue cooking 20 minutes. Add-green beans, potato, and

cook until vegetables are done. Add dumplings. (Serves 6-8) DUMPLINGS: Sift 1 cup flour,  $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon salt and  $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon baking powder; add  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup milk, and 2 tablespoons salad oil to make dough soft. Drop dough from table spoon onto stew. Cover tightly for 8 minutes, and simmer Turn dumplings over and continue cooking 8 minutes long

#### Cream Cheese Pie

12 ounces cream cheese 2 eggs, beaten

3/4 cup sugar 2 teaspoon vanilla

1 teaspoon lemon juice

Combine above ingredients and mix until light and creamy. Pour into graham cracker crust and bake in 350 degree oven 15-20 minutes. Remove and cool while top-

TOPPING: Mix one cup sour cream, 31/2 tablespoon sugar and 1 teaspoon vanilla. Pour mixture over pie and back 10 minutes longer. Refrigerate 5 hours before serv-

CRUST: Combine 14 finely crumbled graham crackers with 1/4 cup melted butter. Pat into 9 inch pie plate.
