Exemptions, Deductions Can Reduce Sting of Income Tax

(This is the third of a series of articles on federal and California income tax filing. This information has been provided by the Committee on Taxation of The California Society of Certified Public Accountants.)

You can substantially reduce your income tax by taking full advantage of exemptions and legitimate deductions.

\$600 additional for each tax-payer 65 or older at year's end. \$600 additional for each de-pendent of taxpayer.

CALIFORNIA income tax rules are the same, except that the personal exemption is \$1500 instead of \$600—and if husband and wife file separate returns, the total exemption of \$3000 may be divided between \$3000 may be divided between

\$3000 may be divided between them in any way they wish. But there is no additional exemption because of age.

There are various conditions to be considered in claiming exemptions. One example is that "blindness" does NOT mean total lack of vision. Anthesis that while the primary. other is that while the primary test of a "dependent" is that he receives more than half of his support from YOU, he must also be a resident of the U. S. Panama, Mexico, Canada or the Canal Zone. There are other conditions and requirement for dependents—all of which can be quickly checked through your local Internal Revenue Service or California Franchise Tax Board offices.

"HEAD OF Household" is a "HEAD OF Household" is a special category which brings advantage to one who is sup-porting a dependent but does not have a spouse with whom he can file a joint return. For Federal tax purposes this will permit such a person to com-pute his tax on a special tax rate schedule which gives him half as much benefit as a joint

return.

For California purposes, no special tax rate schedule is used for "Head of Household" but the taxpayer is permitted a personal exemption of \$3000 —instead of \$1500 plus \$600 for the dependent.

YOU CAN deduct contributions— at their fair value—to religious, charitable, scientific, literary and educational organizations, and non-profit ceme-teries. But they must be actually given—not just "pledged." The limit of such charitable

contributions is 20% for both Fereral and State returns—but 30% for Federal if at least 10% was for religious organizations, schools, exempt hospitals, or the Salvation Army.

INTEREST you've paid on personal loans and other in-debtedness is deductible. Don't forget the mortgage on your home, auto financing and other installment purchases. You can even deduct "carrying charges" up to 6 per cent of the aver-age monthly unpaid balance.

Most taxes you've paid, except Federal, are deductible.
(California income tax is not, of course, deductible on your California return).

\$600 for each taxpayer, regardless of circumstances.
\$600 additional for each blind taxpayer.
\$600 additional for each taxpayer 55 or older at year's end.
