# Harbor Hospital Heart Study Progressing on Four Fronts

**HARBOR HOSPITAL 3-30** X Research work is now being done for the cure and prevention of heart diseases in various hospitals and clinics throughout the land and the Harbor General Hospital is no exception.

Dr. Steve C. K. Liu, the resident heart specialist made these remarks at an interview recently. Dr. Liu is the director of the cardio-pulmonary clinic and also chief cardiologist at the Harbor General Hospital.

**THE RESEARCH** work is being sponsored by the Long Beach Heart Assn., The Los Angeles County Heart Assn., the resident doctors and friends' and patients at the present time.

The Los Angeles County Heart Assn. is now having the Annual Heart Fund Drive during the month of February, with the door to door campaign to be conducted from today through Sunday.

(4) To dissolve blood clots in the blood vessels by the use of chemicals.

MANY OTHER projects of this nature are expected to get under way in the very near future.

A much larger research laboratory will be included in the million dollar hospital that is now under construction on this same location and the staff of Heart specialists expect to be located in this building within the next year.

THERE ARE four basic projects under way at the present time with the No. 1, being almost completed.

- (1) The study of the elastic properties of the human heart and especially the left atrium of the normal heart and also in the heart of patients afflicted with rheumatoid heart disease.
- (2) Study of the control of blood in the lungs and the effects on the heart.
- (3) Protection of blood supply into the heart of persons with or without coronary heart disease.
