



Veterans Advised to Keep Insurance Premiums Paid

Veterans Service Officer Sara R. Bridges said today she has some important advice for veterans holding GI insurance that both arean policies, regarding both prem-ium payments and dividends.

First of all, there have been some delays reported by the VA Insurance Center in the VA Insurance Center in the mailing of monthly premium notices, customarily sent out in packages of 12 for a year's supply. If policyholders have not received the packages by the time a premium is due, the service officer emphasized they should mail in their pay-ments anyway so there will be no danger of a lapse.

PAYMENT checks should in PAYMENT checks should in such cases be accompanied by a note to the VA Insurance Center (usually in Denver, Colo.) giving the veteran's name, address, and policy number, If you pay premiums on more than one policy, be sure to list all policy numbers. This would prevent credit of the entire payment to one the entire payment to one policy, leaving the other to lapse.

The agency has announced every effort is being made to mail out as many dividends as possible be-fore the end of winter. It is anticipated that the It is anticipated that the

the standard that the speed-up process will enable the VA to pay all dividends by no later than June 30, and that the great majority will be out well in advance of that date out date.

ORDINARILY, the annual insurance dividends or refunds are paid during the year, as near as possible to the anni-versary date of the veteran's policy. Refunds are being made on

both permanent plan and term insurance policies. It will be to the advantage of both the veterans and the VA, the service officer declared again, if policyholders do NOT make in-dividual inquiries about their dividends.
