An emphasis will be placed on safe driving habits, and
this week, the increasing number of traffic accidents caused
by motorists making U-turns raises the question:
"When may you make a U.turn?" The answers:

1. Where there are traffic signals you may make a
U-turn only when a sign is posted saying "U-turn
OX" or "Permitted."
2. In a business district, you may make a U-turn only
at an intersection not controlled by traffic signals.
3. In a residential area, you may make a U-turn only i
there are no cars appoaching within 200 feet.
4. It it illegal to make a U-turn at any time in front
of a fire station, and no vehicle may use the drive
way of a station to turn around and go in the op
posite direction.
5. You may never make a U-turn acress double white
lines on any roadway.
Remember, traffic laws are made and enforced to pro-
tect you, the motorist. Be courteous in your driving.
