Mandatory motor vehicle inspection prevents accidents.
Texas reports that 15 per cent of its accidents were due to unsafe vehicle condition before inspection started. After inspection became mandatory, the figure dropped to five per cent. The first year that New Jersey had mandatory inspection there was a drop of 32 per cent in traffic deaths. n the past three years, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Rhode Island have adopted periodic motor vehicle inspec-tion laws. More than one-third of the states (18) now include motor inspections as part of their traffic control and accident prevention programs.
These states account for more than one-third of the nation's motor vehicle population. The other states leave to chance the maintenance of vehicles in an erates drop for both bodily injury and property dayage. proper condition.

THERE ARE five important reasons why unsafe vehicle condition has never been given proper recognition as a cause of accidents:

(1) Vehicles are ofter damaged beyond the point of de-termining condition at the time of the accident.

(2) Accident investigations

tend to concentrate on the driver and driving condition.

(3) Many investigators are not trained to recognize evidence of unsafe vehicle condition.

(4) Accident reporting procedures in different states are not uniform.

(5) Drivers are reluctors to the driver and driving condition.

not uniform.

(5) Drivers are reluctant to admit maintenance neglect, fearing prosecution for contribute. tributory negligence.

IN SPITE of these handi-caps, it is reasonable to assume that vehicle condition does play an important part in traf-fic accident experiences. The national average death rate (deaths per 100 million ve-hicle miles of travel) in 1959

The average rate for states with mandatory inspection, laws was 4.7, about 15 per cent below the national average. States without vehicle inspection programs average 6.1, or 13 per cent above the national average.

TO ACHIEVE minimum requirements for maintenance of a vehicle in good mechanical condition, that is, safe for op-eration on public streets and highways, at least the follow-ing parts should be inspected:

(1) Brakes, (2) Lights, (3) Steering and wheel alignment, (4) Tires and wheels, (5) Exhaust system, (6) Windshield and other glass, (7) Windshield wipers, and (8) Horn. On commercial vehicles several other parts also need careful period. parts also in ic inspection. parts also need careful period
