

Foods Co. Kenney's Thornton Tops Own CIF Mark in 880 Meet for City Title

Kenny's Shoe Repair of the Open League downed St. James Church, winner of the Church League, Thursday night by a healthy 80-57 margin, in the first rounds of the 1960-61 City Championship Playoffs.

Foods Co. earned a shot at the championship by defeating the Combo League leading Shell Chemical Jets in the second game of Thursday's play-offs. In a hair-raising overtime Foods Co. managed to hit for five free throws which helped them over the top 59-56.

Between Kenny's Shoe and St. James Church was the 27 points tallied by Kenny's ace William Leedom while high man for St. James was Gil Peterson with 17.

DESPITE a determined effort on the part of Shell Chemical, who trailed at the half 27-20 and fought Foods Co. to a tie in the closing seconds of the game, the men from Foods Co. scored an overtime victory of 7-4, winning the game 59-56.

Torrance High's distance speedster Mike Thornton, whose specialty was the mile, has been a terror in the half mile lately.

In a spike meet with Beverly Hills Friday, Thornton broke his own CIF half mile mark of 1:56.7 with a devastating clocking of 1:55.6, making him one of the fastest high school half-milers in the nation.

Sparked by buzz-bomb Thornton, the Tartars defeated the host Normans, 55-44.

Beverly Hills' Steve Beck turned in a blazing 4:24.2 clocking in the mile, just over the CIF record of 4:19.8.

Although Buzz Tauley and Steve Gunzberg were double winners in the sprints and hurdles respectively, Thornton and Beck took the spotlight as they recorded two of the nation's best times.

Beck's effort shattered his high school record of 4:27 which he set three weeks ago in a dual meet.
