New Tower Raised at Site Of First Methodist Church

Crowning of the new sanctuary addition to the existing buildings of the Torrance Methodist Church was done Monday. A 75-foot steel frame-work weighing four tons was erected by rigging crews at the front of the building located at the corner of Carson and El Prado.

The spire, rooted in a nine-ton concrete base, will be covered with glass and ornamental iron grill-work, according to Mrvin Schwab, chairman of the church's building committee.

Construction on the new addition was started Jan. 16 and is slated to be completed by July 16. Rev. Gil Zimmerman, pastor of the church pointed out, and added that the brick addition will seat 500 people.

223rd Street Improvement Plans Told

Allocation of \$3600 for improvement work on 223rd St. westerly of Meyler St. in the Carson area was authorized by the Board of Supervisors.

Supervisor Burton W. Chace, who represents the area, said the project will consist of extending the pavement on the northerly side of 223rd St. to join recently constructed curb and gutter, and resurface the northerly half of the existing pavement.

Recent traffic counts disclosed that more than 1500 vehicles use this portion of 223rd St. daily, according to Chace who urged drivers to use caution when traveling through the construction zone after work begins.
