

### Square Dance Clubs Plan 'Bunny Hop'

An "Easter Bunny Hop" has been scheduled for Saturday night by the Scott Park Squares, to be held at the Scott Park Community Building, 23410 S. Catskill Ave., in the Avalon Village. ### Mobil Booklet Outlines Fuel Tax Refunding

Details of how power boat owners and users may obtain refunds of state and federal gasoline taxes are given in a new edition of a tax refund bulletin, just published by Mobil Oil Co.

The eight-page booklet makes available in one publication complete information about taxes in each state and Canadian province. It lists the amount of the tax, tells which state grants refunds and how much, and which forms must be used in applying for refunds.

Twenty-nine states and the District of Columbia grant full refunds of the state tax gasoline used in motor boats. Fourteen of these, plus the District of Columbia, grant the refund under provisions of their laws exempting non-highway users of gasoline from having to pay the tax.

Partial tax refunds are granted motor boat users in seven states, while 15 states grant no refund at all to pleasure boat operators.

In each state there is a time limit imposed on filing for tax refunds.
