Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt will appear in person at Harbor College Monday, March 28, at 8 p.m., to deliver an address entitled, "It the United States Facing Up to World Leadership?" according to an announcement today by Edward W. Robings, chairman of the Harbor College Forum Committee.

Mrs. Roosevelt's lecture is a forum special event and is not one of the eight regular programs of the current forum series Robings said.

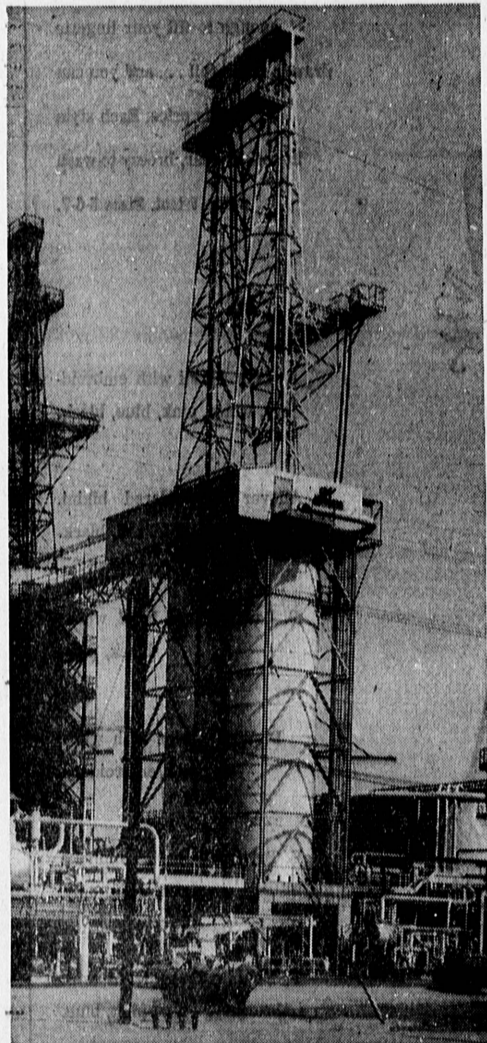

### New Unit Now 'On Stream' At Local Mobil Refinery

Mobil Oil Co. has announced that a new delayed coking unit, now going "on stream," gives its 190th and Crenshaw refinery one of the largest delayed coking installations in the world. The new unit, with a daily throughput of 9300 barrels, increases Torrance coking capacity to 35,000 barrels a day, equal to the entire throughput of many refineries.

The new coking facilities, constructed by Bechtel Corp., cost upwards of \$4,500,000. MOBIL OIL officials explained that the new installation is particularly useful to the Torrance refinery because much of the crude supply is low gravity heavy oil. The delayed coking operation helps make saleable products such as gasoline and solid petroleum coke out of

the low-value "ends" of the crude oil barrel. "It's a practical adjustment to a changing supply and demand situation," said R. E. Lauterbach, Mobil's general manager of Southern California manufacturing.

"INCREASED imports of natural gas into this area and passage of Rule 62 of the Los Angeles County Air Pollution Control District which prohibits the burning of fuel oil during the so-called smog season have resulted in a reduction in the consumption of fuel oil (a heavy oil product). Mobil Oil Co. expanded its Torrance coking facilities in order to compensate for this marketing situation and make the best possible use of its crude supply."
