Soloists Do Outstanding Job in 'Faust' Concert, Reviewer Says

Under the inspired direction of Elyse Aehle, the Torrance-South Bay Civic Symphony provided a rewarding Sunday afternoon for the scores of music lovers who came to Redondo High School auditorium when Gounod's immortal opera "Faust" was presented in concert form. The audience was large and warm, expressing its approval enthusiastically at various points during the concert.

Sharing the program with Miss Aehle were several gifted singers, in addition to her effective orchestral and choral musicians, who performed with precision and care. Possibly the most entertaining of the vocal soloists was Joan Trona, soprano, who took the part of Margarita and whose rich voice soared above the orchestra. She had absolute vocal command of the situation.

CAPABLE tenors are all too rare, but Miss Aehle discovered one in the person of Joseph Rehard, possessor of a voice that is light and appealing but able to rise to great

heights as Faust. Lyle Heck as Mephistopheles had just the right sardonic touch in his rendition, while Winifred Mewborn's "Flower Song" (Siebel) provided a moment of great enjoyment. Her voice revealed a lovely quality in this.

A unique method of coordinating and explaining the drama was employed by the use of a narrator to fill gaps in the story. David Bond, honorary president of ANTA, enacted this role to perfection.

The entire stage picture was a most attractive one, with the black and white clothing of the conductor, the orchestra members and the North American Chorus members. The vocal soloists, colorfully costumed in the style of the period which the opera was set, enhanced their singing by a few bits of action which were restrained and in good taste.

The dramatic Finale, in which the voices of the tenor and soprano blended with the orchestra, held the attention of the audience completely

Flowers were presented to Miss Trona and to Miss Aehle, without whose vision these concerts would not be in existence. Afterward, a fitting tribute was paid to the conductor and orchestra by Mrs. Leland Atherton Irish, former resident of the South Bay area and former manager of the Hollywood

and hearts of the community. Where citizens can join in the performance and appreciation of great art, there they are well on the way toward a well-rounded existence. Square Dancing Sessions Slated

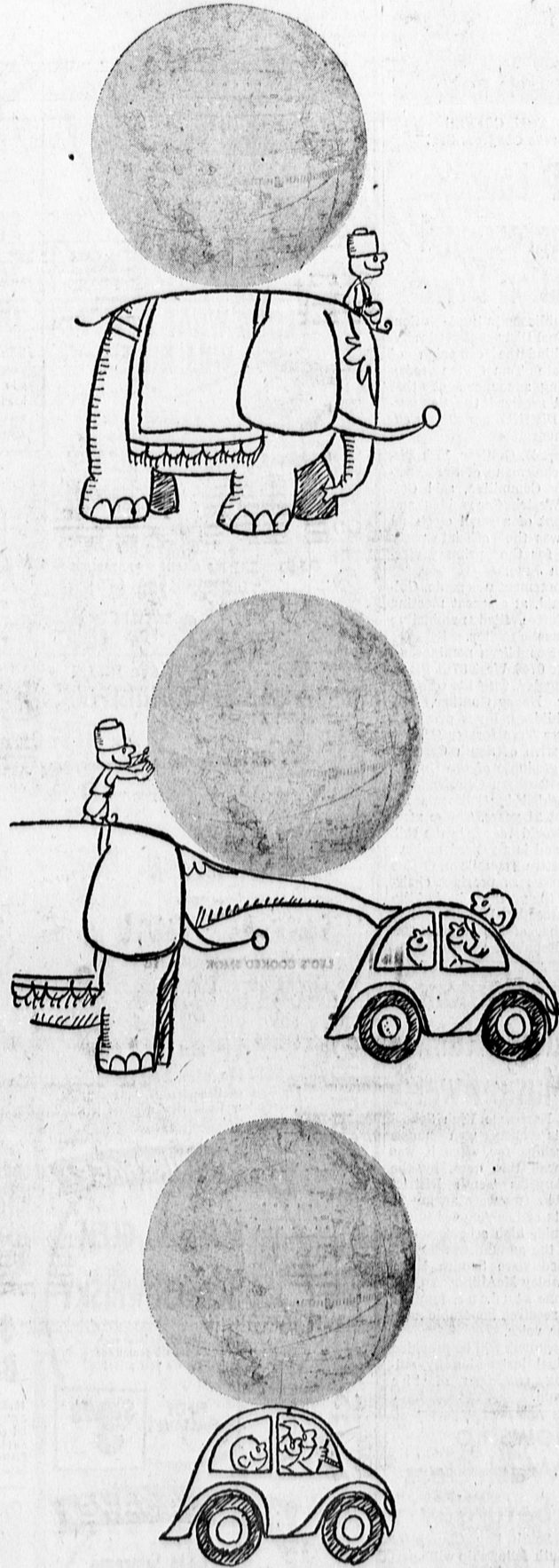
Semi-monthly square dancing sessions will begin Saturday at McMasters Park under auspices of the Torrance Recreation Dept.

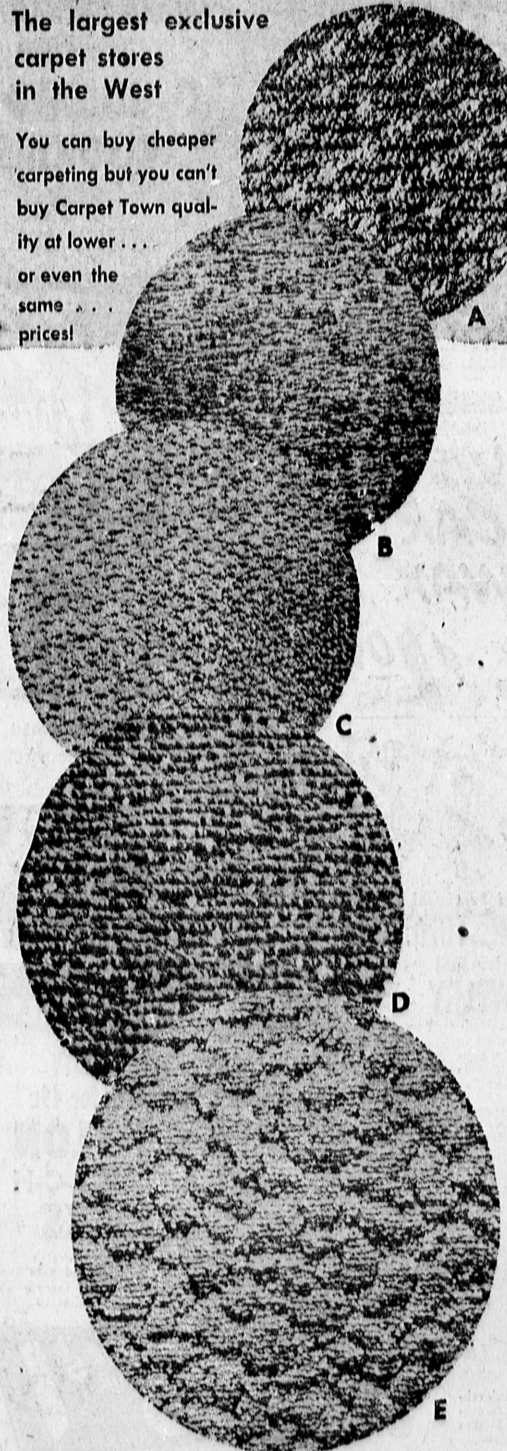
