Civic Leaders Meet New Gas Co. Division Manager

Introduction of Georg Babbe as the new Southwest division manager for the Southern California Gas Co. was made earlier this week at two special dinner meetings which were attended by some 200 civic, business and industry leaders and members of the press from communities throughout the area.

C. W. Shupp, who has been Gas company Southwest division manager for the last three years and was an active civic leader and resident of the Inglewood area since 1956, said that Babbe will assume full responsibility for company operations in the division on April 1.

Gas company president and general manager F. M. Banks, who announced Babbe's appointment, was also principal

speaker during the special programs to welcome Babbe as the new division manager and to salute Carl Shupp for his service to the gas company and the community during his term as manager here.

Shupp, who became Southwest division manager for the utility in September, 1956, has been named division manager of the gas company's recently formed Metropolitan division.

The new Metropolitan division coming under Shupp's direction is one of two large divisions formed in a split of the gas company's Central or Los Angeles division. Roughly, the new Metropolitan division and the second new division, to be called Northwest, divide the entire Los Angeles area along an east-west line running approximately through the heart of the downtown district. Both of the new divisions will operate from the Flower St. headquarters of the gas company in Los Angeles.

Babbe joined the gas company at its Los Angeles headquarters in 1949, and a year later became supervisor of distribution training. Between 1951 and 1956 he served as staff engineer, and since 1956 he has been Superintendent of Distribution for the Los Angeles area.

A native of Butte, Mont., and a graduate of Northwestern University, he served during World War II as a lieutenant in the Naval Submarine Service and is now a Commander in the Naval Reserve.

For several years Babbe has

been active in Pacific Coast Gas Assn. and American Gas Assn. programs, and is a member of the Los Angeles Junior Chamber of Commerce. He recently received the Durward Howes Award as outstanding Junior Chamber of Commerce member of the year for 1959.
